

Bellaluz garden meeting on 19th June with Antonio

It was agreed that dead palm stumps would be cut down and removed.

Oleander would be planted on the villa side of the screen at Villa 6.

Stones, cactus and ground plants would be planted on the slope at the end of block 14 to retain the soil. The two dead trees would be cut down and later in the year the two olive trees would be pruned and shaped to increase light.

Hibiscus shrubs would be treated to eradicate greenfly and where they and other bushes had outgrown their pots, they would be transplanted. As the palm used to create the garden in Calle Ulia could harbour harmful beetles, it will be removed.

Empty planters outside the pool will be planted up and placed far enough away from the wall to deter use as a step up into the pool area. Planters in the pool cafe area are to be restocked.

Wherever planters lack colour, easy maintenance semi succulents will be planted.

The pot moved from the bottom of the ramp at block 13 is to be moved to the bare area to the right of the steps between 13 and 14.

Trees identified as obscuring balcony views will be topped.

Grass areas are to have a weed and feed treatment.

Antonio will liaise with Chris to implement an automatic watering system to the streets with the long term goal of reducing water consumption and stop the wasteful use of manpower that hand watering produces.
